CHASSIDIC CLASSIC - THE INNER SOUL OF CHASSIDIC MUSIC

In setting out to record the sequel to our outstandingly successful first "TIME TO DANCE" edition, we were mindful that second editions are too often paler imitations of the initial success. We thus set out to add a new dimension to the reproduction of chassidic music and believe that this goal has been accomplished. Thus, this recording follows the theme of "TIME TO DANCE" in bringing chassidic classics to our audience, but surpasses the first recording in a way which breaks new ground.

The soul of a nation is mirrored in its music. What melodies stir it to joy, to tears, to accomplishment and to lofty spiritual heights? Chassidic music is not mood music. It shares nothing with contemporary music that panders to the emotions. It is directed toward the inner soul. It prods, demands, and requires the listener to confront the greatness that lies within each one of us.

In this recording we have sought to faithfully reproduce every nuance of the original nigunim. Recording with an eighty-piece symphony orchestra and utilizing the talents of musicians from the Israeli Symphony Orchestra, we hope to have recorded the original *nigunim*, body and soul. The richness of tone and the full complement of symphonic instrumentation have for the first time been brought to the interpretation of a *nigun*.

Jo this we add that the recording process will not be complete unless the listener brings himself as an active participant rather than as a passive receptor to this music. In chassidic lore it is taught that the gate of nigunim (song) is adjacent to the gate of *teshuvah* (repentance). By faithfully recording the inner soul of this magnificent music, we hope to have brought the two gates within reach of all who both listen and sing the *nigunim* that stirred the souls of great *tzaddikim* throughout the ages.
